Appropriate Three Million, seven hundred and sixty-five thousand and sixty-six dollars to the services of the year ending 31st March 2006.

Short title
and
Commencement

1. This Ordinance shall be entitled the **Isabel Provincial Assembly Appropriation Ordinance 2005** and shall come into force upon approval of the Minister in accordance with Section 30 (2) of the Provincial Government Act 1997 and Publication in the Solomon Islands Gazette.

Authorization of
the Issue of
SBD \$3,765,066
from the

2. The Appropriation from the Provincial Fund is hereby authorized of the sum of **Three million, seven hundred and sixty-five thousand and sixty-six dollars** to be applied for the purpose specified in Section 34 (2) of the Provincial Government Act 1997, and to the services of the financial year ending 31st March 2006.

Appropriation

3. The sum specified in the preceding section shall be appropriated for the supply of Heads, Subheads specified and in the amounts respectively specified in relation thereof, in the schedule to this Ordinance.
