“DELEGATION OF POWERS BY EXECUTIVE”

(i) The Executive may from time to time, either generally or particularly delegate to the Provincial Secretary or an authorised officer the powers of the Executive under this ordinance except powers specified in section 19. |

- (ii) Subject to any general or specific directions given or conditions attached by the Executive, the Provincial Secretary or authorised officer may exercise those powers in the same manner and with the same effect as if they had been conferred on the Provincial Secretary or authorised officer by this section and not by delegation.
- (iii) Any delegation under this section shall be recorded and maintained by the Executive.
- (iv) Until a delegation made under this is revoked, it shall continue in force according to its tenor.
- (v) Every delegation made under this section shall be revocable at will, and no such delegation shall prevent the exercise of any powers by the Executive.
