HOLDEN: At Auki in the British Solomon Islands

Protectorate on Friday the 30xk 29th day of September 1966 at xxxxxxx 1800 o'clock in the xxxxx noon.

Charge explained to the accused: By Judge.

Accused when called upon to plead says: I received the money but it was stolen from me.

Court enters a plea of: Not Guilty.

Court adjourns for hearing to 8.30 a.m. 30th Septem ber. Bail is extended.

0830 30.9.66 Court Reassembles. Parties as before.

Mr. Morgan. I will proceed directly with evidence.

PWI; Ragosa Tuhaika

P.C. 69, Police Auki. Sworn on Bible.

In 1965 I received an advance from Govt to buy a bicylce. I got it 23.7.65. It was \$40. I was going to get the bicke from Chan Wing Store in Honiara.

I know the Acc: In July/August Acc: was employed by Marine Department. He was in the LAMOA. On 30.7.65
I spoke with Acc: This was at the wharf in Auki. I asked him to bring me a bicycle from Honiara. He agreed.
I then gave him £I7.I0.0. That was the cost of a bicyle. Constable Baeloa was present. I told Acc: where I wanted him to buy the bicycle. He said he would buy the bicycle and pay for it and bring it back in two weeks. The Acc: did not return in two weeks time and I did not get the bicycle. His ship did not come back. On 24.8.65
I received a letter from Acc: (W: shown letter)
That is the letter.

( Acc: admits the letter)

( Retter put in Ex A )

I still have not received the bicycle or the money. I have had to refund the advance to the Go\_vt.

I agree I suspected that you had used the money for yourself

By Court: I have not seen the Acc since I received Ex A. I just handed the matter to the police and the rest followed. I did think of a civil suit but did not institute it.

I know the Acc: I know PWI also. On 30.7.65
I was present when PWI asked Acc: to buy the bicy ce.
This took place on the wharf at Auki. BWI also gave Acc some money. It was £17.10.0. Acc: agreed to buy the

bicycle and said that he would put the bicycle in the Central Police station Honiara until there was ship for Auki. I know that PWI has not yet had the bicylce.

In I965 I was in Marine Depart. I was serving in the LAUMUA. About Ist August I965 LAUMUA was in Honiara. I know the Acc: He used to serve in the same ship.

About Ist August Acc: went ashore and went to the town. It was a Sunday morning. About two hours later he returned to the ship drunk. It was about 0730 when he went ashore and he came back about 0930. The AMUMUA was at Honiara half a day. The ship sailed about midday that day. We sailed for Gizo. Acc: was on board. When the ship sailed Acc: did not do any work. He went to sleep on the deck. The following morning we reached Gizo. At Gizo we tied up at the wharf. Acc: went ashore and came back with a lot of bread, cake and sugar and he brought many friends with him. He brought more than five people on board. Acc: did not usually do this when we were in port.

The Ship left Auki midnight, reached Honiara early morning and sailed for @ixo midday and reached Gizo the following morning.

### XX by Acc:

I confirm we arrived on Sunday morning in Honiara. When we arrived at Honiara I unloaded the boat. Acc: did not help. The cargo was general cargo. The labourers were PWD. It took It hours to discharge. The crew of the ship all went off. We carried a crew of 8. I was the 2nd mate and I gave the permission for the crew to go ashore. I ordered the crew to be back two hours before sailing time. You did not say you were going to buy a bicyle. I cannot say if a bicyle shop was open on a Sunday. I say you were drunk when you came back to the ship because you said so and went and lay down. I cannot say what you did with the XXXXX money. I did not know you had it. At Gizo I do not know how money you spent on bread etc. That was the WXXXXX first time I have seen you bring friends on board. You have not done it often. We had been paid in Honiara on the 3Ist July before the ship went to Auki and back. I cannot say how long it was after we were paid that the ship sailed. The Acc: was on £8 per month. I am sure you were paid before going over to Auki. I am not sure whether pay was given before or after the trip to Auki.

I know the Acc: On 22 9 65 I intertiewed the Acc: I cautioned him. I wrote it down. He signed it.
He made a voluntary statement in Pidgin. I wrote it
down. I read it back to him. He signed it as correct. I also signed it.

indicated in the statement which he made to the police, he went ashore in Honiara with the rest of the crew and got drunk in the Mendana Hotel Bar. In the course of that party he had in his trousers pocket not only his own pay but also the money given him by PWI which to buy the bicycle. He woke up next morning in the Kukum labour lines and found his money finished. The only point in this case is the timing. This incident occurred many months ago. Reading the Acc: statement (and the evidence) to the police it is clear that the ship on its return from Auki spent on the early moring of Saturday stayed in Honiara overnight till Sunday midday. Rxx The crew was paid on the Saturday morning which was the last day of the month and they sailed again the following day. Of course the crew went ashore on Saturday night and drank their wages and in the case of the Accused that included PWIs money.

I have no reason to doubt but that, as the Acc:
